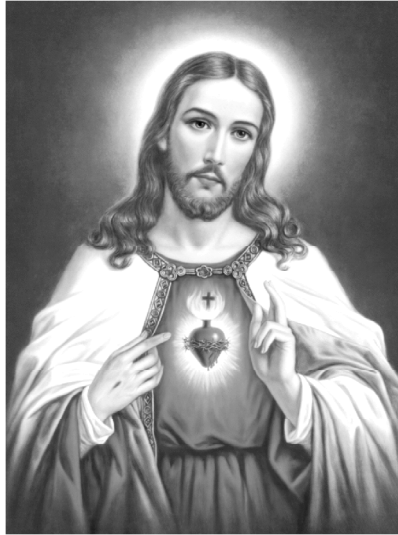

PROSPECTUS

CMI Education Policy Statement

We, the Carmelites of Mary Immaculate, after the example of our Founder, St. Kuriakose Elias Chavara, consider education as the integral formation of the human person for the fulfillment of his/her individual and social responsibilities..

Our educational endeavours aim at forming leaders who are intellectually competent, spiritually mature, morally upright, psychologically integrated, physically healthy and socially acceptable, who will champion the cause of justice, love, truth, and peace, and who are ever open to further growth.

We aspire towards creating a just and human society where the dignity of the human person is respected, where unjust social structures are challenged, where our cultural religious heritage of *ahimsa*, religious harmony and national unity are upheld, and where the poor and the marginalized are specially taken care of.

We wish to reach out to the families, primarily of the students, to assist them in their needs, to share in their joys and sorrows, and to help them experience love and freedom, so that the students realize that our educational institutions are an extension of their homes.

Our institutions are open to all students irrespective of caste and creed; they are accepted and cherished as they are, and are helped to grow in their cultural, social and religious traditions.

As they are privileged to be in our institutions, they will also have the right to get acquainted with the person of Jesus Christ and His Gospel. Being institutions established and administered by and for a minority community based on religion, preference will be given to Christians in admissions and appointments and special care taken for the faith formation of the Christian youth.

Our institutions are also open to society at large by making their resources available for ongoing education and growth.

For the realization of this CMI goal of education, we invite students, parents and teachers to share this vision and to co-operate with us wholeheartedly.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

1. As a CMI educational institution, the school considers education as integral to the formation of the human person for the fulfilment of his/her individual and social responsibilities.
2. The school aims at forming leaders who are intellectually competent, spiritually mature, morally upright, psychologically integrated, physically healthy and socially acceptable, who are open to growth and will champion the cause of justice, love, truth and peace.
3. The school also aims at creating a just and human society where the dignity of the human person is respected, where unjust social structures are challenged, where our cultural heritage of ahimsa, religious harmony and national integration are upheld, where the poor and the downtrodden are specially taken care of.
4. The school is open to all students irrespective of caste and creed; they are accepted and cherished as they are and are helped to grow in their cultural, social and religious tradition.
5. The school expects students, parents and teachers to share the CMI vision of education and to co-operate with the school wholeheartedly.

SALIENT FEATURES OF THE SCHOOL

1. The School is a community of students and teachers who live in an atmosphere of a family, loving and respecting each other.
2. It stands for excellence in academic and co-curricular activities of the students.
3. It has professionally competent and morally upright teachers, who are committed to their vocation of forming the future citizens of our country as per our objectives.
4. Its curricular and co-curricular activities take place in accordance with well defined principles and policies spelt out in a carefully prepared action plan.
5. It provides enrichment programs to the high achievers, special coaching to the promising students, remedial coaching to the weak students and counselling facilities to all the students.
6. There are various programs in the school to help the students develop their creative and aesthetic talents along with their academic growth.
7. The school is committed to the goal of promoting internationalism and celebrating it through curricular and extra curricular means by expanding its network with other school and institutions outside the country for mutual exchange of ideas among students and among teachers.
8. All relationships in the school are characterized by love, justice, truth, partnership and mutual respect. The integrated development of every student is the concern of all.

GENERAL RULES

The pupils of this school are expected:

1. to participate fully in all the activities of the school,
2. to observe faithfully the school rules of discipline and obey all duly constituted authorities,
3. to cultivate loyalty and devotion to their family, school and country,
4. to develop healthy habits of mind and body by constant self discipline,
5. to acquire qualities of leadership and competency in the art of expression and persuasion,
6. to strive to be gentlemen and ladies and learn to serve and be helpful to others.

DISCIPLINARY RULES

Academic year & School Timings

1. The academic year is of ten months duration from June to March. It is divided into three terms. The first term is from June to August, the second term from September to December, the third is from January to March.
2. The school time is from 9.15 am to 3.20 pm.
3. The school office is open from 9.00 am to 4.00 pm.
4. Pupils must be in their classrooms by the first bell at 9.15 am. At the second bell, on the days when there is school assembly, all should march to the place assigned to their respective classes on the assembly ground. On other days, they sit in their classrooms in silence. At the third bell all stand up for prayer.
5. At the end of the day before the students disperse, there will be a thanks-giving prayer led by one of the senior class leaders.

6. During intervals and playtime pupils should not go out of the school campus. They should avoid unwanted shouting or quarrelling or the use of discourteous language.

Admission

7. Students are admitted to the school at the beginning of every academic year. New admissions are made on the basis of the students' performance in the school they studied last and also on the basis of their performance in the entrance test.
8. As per rule new students are admitted to LKG and Standard I. Pupils seeking admission to LKG and Standard I for any academic years should register their names before the end of December.
9. Admission to other standards may be given according to the availability of seats based on an entrance test in the last week of April.
10. Application forms for registration will be available at the school office in the month of November/December.

Leave of absence

11. Regular attendance is expected of every student. No student shall absent himself/herself from the class without the prior permission of the class-teacher or Principal. If prior permission cannot be obtained for reasons beyond control, an application for leave (in due form) signed by the parent/guardian should be sent to the Principal on the first day of absence.
12. No leave of absence will be granted for monthly or terminal examination. Absence from test papers and examinations will be considered a serious breach of school regulations. In case of illness, a medical certificate should be sent in.

13. No student will be sent home, even in urgent need unless a duly authorized person comes to take him/her home.

Promotion

14. Promotion is granted on the basis of the general progress of the pupil during the academic year, not merely on the results of the annual examinations. The records of periodic tests, monthly tests, terminal examinations, etc., will be taken into account at the time of promotion.
15. A minimum attendance of 75% of the total working days of the academic year is compulsory for promotion.
16. Results declared at the end of the year are final in all cases and will not be reconsidered.

Academic Grades

17. Students are given the following grades in the final examinations according to their overall performance in the exams. The mark equivalents of the grades are as follows:

18. Students who absent themselves from classes for 15 cosecutive days or more without intimation, will have their names removed from the rolls.
19. A student who fails twice consecutively in the same class will not be permitted to continue his/her study in the school.
20. It is mandatory for pupils to speak in English while in the campus.

Rules of personal and Interpersonal Behaviour

21. Students should bring their hand book to school daily. For the entries made in the hand book in the column intended for parents the students should obtain the parent's acknowledgement by signature and show it to the Principal/Teacher the very next day.
22. When a teacher enters or leaves the class, all pupils must stand up.
23. Students may not be called to the phone during class hours. Visitors will not be permitted to see any pupil during class hours. No student shall be called to the office without the written permission of the Principal.
24. Every student is expected to be courteous in talk and behaviour at all times. He/she should speak honestly and frankly and be cheerful. He must use polite expressions and show good manners in conversation.
25. Students should never forget to greet the teachers and elders. They should also greet one another.
26. Students should not damage school property. They should not write on or disfigure the walls, furniture, or library books. Any damage caused through inadvertence or otherwise should be brought to the notice of the school authorities. Those who cause the damage will be liable to repair it at their own cost. Each class will be responsible for looking after the class property.
27. Any exchange of articles or money transaction between students is forbidden.

28. The school is not responsible for books, notebooks, tiffin boxes, or any valuable item lost on the school premises. Every student is responsible for the safe keeping of his/her own belongings. It is not advisable to bring valuable items like jewellery to school.
29. Inattentiveness, indifference to studies, discourtesy towards any member of the staff or any act which affects the discipline and tone of the school will be seriously viewed and in extreme cases they are sufficient reason for dismissal from the school.
30. Students are not permitted to bring cell phones into the school campus. This will be treated as a punishable offence.
31. Immorality, grave insubordination, contempt for authority, wilful damage to school property, malpractice in examinations etc., are sufficient reasons for immediate dismissal.

The School Library

32. Students are permitted to borrow only two books from the school library at a time and should retain them only for a period of two weeks.
33. The librarian may call for the return of a particular book even before the expiry of the due date. Reference books and periodicals should not be taken out of the Reading Room.
34. Borrowers should report any damage, loss of pages, pictures etc. to the librarian before they accept the books.
35. Books borrowed are non-transferable. It is the responsibility of the borrowers to take care of the books borrowed by them.
36. If any book is lost, damaged or badly handled, the actual cost for replacement of the book will have to be paid by the borrower.
37. Every book borrowed should be returned by the end of February, every year. The actual cost for replacement will be realized from defaulters.

38. When a book is returned, please ensure that the librarian has struck off the accession against your name. Otherwise, the book may still remain registered in your name as pending return.
39. Strict silence should be maintained inside the library.

School Uniform

40. Wearing school uniform is obligatory under penalty of exclusion from classrooms. Full school uniform should be worn on all days and on solemn occasions.
41. Students must be clean in their habits and neatly dressed. The uniform must be clean, well-pressed and complete. Students coming untidy dress, with shabby hair, improper footwear, etc., may be refused admittance to class.

School Fee

42. The school collects fee for ten months.
43. The fee will be collected at the school office from 9.00 am to 4.00 pm.
44. The fee rates and other details of the fee will be published in the notice board.

CO-CURRICULAR AND EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

To develop the varied interests and different talents of the pupils we provide ample opportunity through several co-curricular activities. Students are given training in music, painting and other art forms. Participation in one of the co-curricular activities is compulsory in the continuous and comprehensive evaluation of the students. The performance in one or two co-curricular activities will be observed and the grades will be entered in the progress report card/mark transcript.

Literary Association

One of the most important methods for developing creative talent in the literary, artistic and cultural fields in the weekly meeting of the Literary, artistic and cultural fields of the Literary Association. The class teacher gives necessary guidance and direction to the students for conducting these meetings in the most useful way. The elected secretary of the association organizes the meeting in consultation with the class-teacher.

Besides the regular weekly literary associations in classes, students are expected to join and participate actively in at least two of the following organizations.

The Social Service League

We live in a world where there are very rich and utterly poor people. The poor are often neglected. We often forget our duty towards the poor and the needy. This league will try to inculcate in the minds of our young ones our responsibility towards the neglected poor and a love for serving them in their need.

The Science Club

This is meant to create love for, the day-to-day scientific achievements of the modern world. This would help to tickle their curiosity to know more about the thrilling and marvellous contributions of modern science has offered to humanity. Ultimately, this would help the student to equip himself with a creative mind to eradicate poverty and misery from the face of the earth.

The Eco-club

The Eco-club of the school plays a vital role in creating environmental awareness among the future generation. The activities of the club are steered on the basic fact that nature provides each one with all possibility to live close to it. Indiscriminate burning of waste which causes respiratory diseases and the increased use of plastic are the problems which are focused on by the club members.

The History Club

The history club aims at creating awareness among the pupils about our rich historical and cultural heritage. As the motto of the club, "Shaping the destiny of man, through the past, in the present, and into the future", indicates every member to know the past, to cope with the present and to surge ahead into the future as responsible citizen.

Quiz forum

This is special forum which prepares students for various quiz competitions. Students are enrolled in it after a preliminary test.

Study Tours and Field Trips

Educational tour and excursions to places of historical or national importance are conducted for seniors and juniors separately during the academic year. Small children are taken to picnic spots for one-day trips.

FACILITIES

The School Library

We have a good school library with more than 1000 books and more than 5 periodicals. The reference Section has a variety of standard encyclopedias, dictionaries and reference books. There is a qualified librarian, who is always ready to render any help to the users of the library.

Sports and Games

The sports and games facilities on the campus make the students attain physical growth and imbibe sportsman spirit. The school has separate courts for games like basketball and football. Inter class and the Annual Sports Events and Sports Day give the students ample opportunity to exhibit their skills.

Science Lab

The school has a well-furnished science laboratory. It is built with safety measures and is student-friendly. The lab is fully equipped with apparatuses as per the syllabus requirements and can accommodate 40 students at a time.

Computer Lab

We have a dual core desktop computers with 1GB memory. All the machines are networked and have access to internet.

TO THE PARENTS

1. Parents are requested to be in contact with the teachers regularly. At least once in a term they should meet the teachers in person, but on no account they are allowed to go to the classrooms and meet the teachers during class time.
2. Parents are not allowed to meet the students during class hours, without the permission of the Principal. Reports of students, their conduct, punctuality and progress in studies are indicated from time to time on the pages of the Hand book. Parents are requested to take note of these reports, duly sign them with date and to take necessary remedial action.
3. No parent should fail to attend the class-wise Parent-Teacher and Open House meetings after the first terminal exams and the dates of which will be duly communicated to the parents.

4. Parents are requested not to compare a child with another as the students are of different backgrounds, abilities and interests.
5. It is quite natural that at times children may take complaints to their parents concerning school matters. Parents are to bring such cases to the notice of the Principal or to the class-teacher before coming to a hasty judgement.
6. It is up to the parents to bring to the attention of the Principal and the teachers their children's habits or traits of character or any other matter that needs special care and attention.
7. Parents are to see that they do not withdraw their children from the classes for more social functions, so as to break the continuity of study which is essential for progress.
8. All the activities of the school are envisaged and executed in the best interest of the student body. Hence, parents must see that their children actively take part in all the school activities setting aside all other considerations.

PARENTS' TEACHERS' ASSOCIATION (P.T.A)

The Parents', Teachers' Association of the school is constituted of the parents and the teachers on the staff. The aim of the Association is to help the Management in the smooth and efficient running of the school and in planning and executing the developmental and other innovative activities of the school so that it may best achieve the noble ideals of education.
